




WAR Leads GBV March

Innovation and Opportunity in Maun

The Innovation Kgotla has welcomed AbariCom as a key collaborator in providing internet services at the new Maun Innovation Centre, where students are already engaging in hands-on programmes designed to build youth capacity and spark local innovation. Alongside this, the third annual Data Science Scholarship programme has launched, aiming to enroll over 1,500 Batswana this year. The scholarship is now open to youth across 11 SADC countries, including Malawi, Zambia, and Namibia – expanding access to in-demand digital skills across the region.









MAWS Extends Animal Care services across Ngamiland

In recent weeks, MAWS—alongside Equine
Assist Maun and sponsor SPANA—delivered
vital veterinary outreach to Khumaga, Xhoo,
and Ghanzi, sterilising over 70 dogs and cats,
vaccinating more than 160 animals, and treating
130+ donkeys and horses for parasites, wounds,
and other health issues. With support from
community champions like Leroo La Tau, Kukama
Bush Camp, and Paratus Botswana, these clinics
are protecting animal welfare and strengthening
conservation through creating and maintaining a
buffer zone between wild animals and domestic


